While awaiting the results, the player should undergo self-administered RAT within 24 hours of their next game. If the RAT result is negative, they can play in the League.	
After League Game (within 3 days of match)	Report to HKNA President (president.HKNA@netball.org.hk) and HKNA (hkna@hkolympic.org) The players in the same team should do a RAT or PCR test and monitor for symptoms. The opposition team and umpires be notified, and it is recommended that the opposition players and the umpires do a RAT or PCR test and monitor for symptoms. All players from both teams to complete a RAT test within the 24 hours prior to their next match.			No need to report to HKNA. Follow the guidelines above before playing the next game			
After League Game (between 4-7 days of match)	Report to HKNA President (president.HKNA@netball.org.hk) and HKNA (hkna@hkolympic.org) The players in the same team should do a RAT or PCR test and monitor for symptoms. The opposition team and umpires will be notified, and it is recommended that the opposition players and umpires also test to be safe.			No need to report to HKNA. Follow the guidelines above before playing the next game			

PLEASE NOTE: you are not required to send copies of the RAT/PCR test results to HKNA. It is requested to be done on a trust basis.
